Will MY Well Go Dry?

In Western Loudoun, our homes, businesses, farms, and livestock depend on whether we can get water from our wells. But, according to a new scientific study:

- **Our water tables are steadily falling.**
In many areas, the water table has fallen 10-40 feet since 2000.
- **In 1990 there were 10,000 active wells in western Loudoun. Now there are 19,000.**
90% of our wells are now within 550 feet of another well.
- **Hooking rural areas up to Loudoun Water would be financially disastrous.**
It would cost billions and require rapid urbanization.
